## Being a mother in Ethiopia

*Safe motherhood is a fundamental right of women and it should be a clear-cut priority of governments, communities and health professionals. "The Challenges of Safe Motherhood. WHO"*

In the **Universal Declaration of Human Rights** for the first time in history two principles are sanctioned:

- The right to life (article 3). *Everyone has the right to life, liberty and security of person.*
- The right to health and medical care (article 25). *(1) Everyone has the right to a standard of living adequate for the health and well-being of himself and of his family, including food, clothing, housing and medical care and necessary social services, and the right to security in the event of unemployment, sickness, disability, widowhood, old age or other lack of livelihood in circumstances beyond his control. (2) Motherhood and childhood are entitled to special care and assistance.*

The actual presence of these rights is strongly dependant on the economic power of the State and therefore they are much more limited in poor countries.

CCM considers the **right to health** as one of its founding values. Among our fundamental

principles, beside respect for human dignity, non religious background, participation in the activities of the community, solidarity as relevant to justice, we also include the choice to work with the poorest whose health right is most disregarded. Among them, **pregnant women and children are definitely the frailest**. The time of delivery is the period when efficient health services can make a difference for both women and babies.

That's why our activities are mostly focused on mothers and children and our **projects grant qualified assistance during pregnancy and delivery, care and vaccination during infancy**. The joy of a safe delivery and post natal care is a fundamental right that all the mothers in the world should have.

Unluckily the fourth and fifth Millennium Developing Goals, respectively reduce by two thirds the under-five mortality rate and reduce by three quarters the maternal mortality ratio and achieve universal access to reproductive health, will not be reached by 2015, especially in Sub-Saharan Africa where we work.

In order to disclose the situation, we launched the Campaign **Smiles of African Mothers** in 2011. We hope that knowing these data many people will be willing to work with us.

We want to reduce injustice and allow more and more mothers to smile with their children. We found the collaboration of many mothers, among whom the director of Magnum Photos, who let us have some photographs from Magnum archive which were shot in the countries where we work. This allowed us to realize the exhibition Smiles of African Mothers in October 2012.

**The new section Being a Mother in Ethiopia** is made up by pictures related to CCM projects in Ethiopia, shot in February 2013 by Bieke Depoorter. The new section is especially devoted to motherhood; motherhood as a unique time marking a profound change in the woman, motherhood as a social strength changing the relationships in the family and in the community.

The setting up of the new section in June 2013, launched one of the projects for next year: the photography contest "Mothers' Smiles Meet", that invites to represent with a picture a daily moment of a mother living in Italy. To be a mother is both wealth and great commitment, in Africa as well as in Italy. As we like to meet the smiles of African mothers, we will like to meet the smiles of Italian mothers.

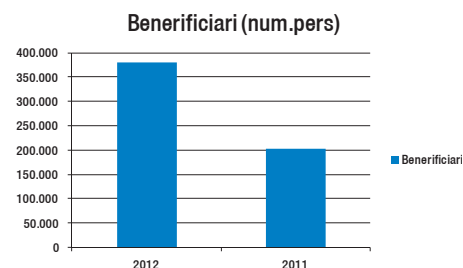
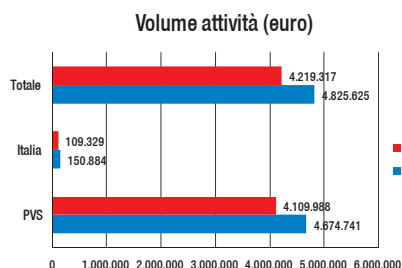

# Analysis of the last three years

## Members meet at the end of term

The Meeting held on 29<sup>th</sup> June was an important moment because it marked the end of the term for the Executive Board elected in 2010. It was a very busy and meaningful period and **the meeting was a good occasion to draw conclusions.**

I would like to highlight some important steps and the challenges for the next years. Since 2010 CCM has greatly increased its activities both in underdeveloped countries and in Italy, carrying out larger projects and reaching more people. A big investment was made to reinforce the presence of CCM in underdeveloped countries and to enhance the efficacy of the organization. In particular some key figures were added in order to effect a higher quality of our interventions (local Health Advisor, higher number of Project Managers). We are implementing our accounting system which will allow pinpoint monitoring of budgets, we magnified administration audit, we are strengthening our public relations and fundraising activities. Since the end of 2011 the legacy D'Ubaldo consolidated the patrimony and allowed larger investments, enhancement of activity and of fundraising, co-sponsorship of projects and balance of the ac-



counts. The organizational commitment was accompanied by reflections and formalization of the CCM mission and vision. We produced the **supporting groups document**, the document "Being on the Field" which reaffirms the importance of missions to underdeveloped countries, we endorsed the activities of the supporting groups and the constitution of new ones. Still many challenges are ahead. One of them is the present economic crisis and the difficulty to

raise money. The strong competition to obtain institutional funds prompts us to consider new paths in order to achieve economic sustainability and to create working networks with institution and individuals. It will be necessary to design middle-term plans spanning the next 2-4 years. Before concluding I want to thank the Board that concluded its mandate for their commitment, faith and determination in boosting CCM and I wish success to the next Board.

## Renewal of the Executive Board

During the meeting held on 29<sup>th</sup> June 2013 the new Executive Board has been elected. The new boards are: Bertini Marilena, Galvagno Silvio Angelo, Dacquino Stefano, Sicuro Marco, Ponzio Francesco Maria, Zara Gian Paolo and Cecchetto Maeina. The Audit Board has been renewed too; the elected are Farfan Leila Rosa, Fontanella Luisella and Collidà Gian Piero.

During the Council of 10<sup>th</sup> July the new appointments were decided: Marilena Bertini President, Silvio Galvagno Vice President, Marco Sicuro Treasurer.

## A prize dedicated to Pino

*CCM through the Medicine Academy of Turin bestows a prize in memory of Doctor Pino Meo, Italian surgeon who specialized in "primary surgery in rural areas" in South Sudan. The prize will be assigned to a young doctor, specialized in General Surgery in the last three years.*

*The prize is meant to allow medical work and research on surgical techniques suitable for "poor" health structures. The activity will take place in the health structures managed by CCM in the Horn of Africa and it will last at least 3 months. The prize covers travelling and lodging expenses*

*in the established period and in the location agreed upon. The commission bestowing the prize will be formed by the President and Secretary of the Academy and from the President of CCM.*

*The applications should arrive within 30<sup>th</sup> September 2013, together with CV, Dissertation of Specialization and Certificates of Graduation and Specialization.*

**Being a Mother in Ethiopia.** That's the title of the new section of Smiles of African Mothers, the exhibition installed by CCM and Magnum Photos, opened on 21<sup>st</sup> June in Carlo Alberto Square, Turin. **Dedicated to CCM commitment to mothers and children health in Ethiopia,** the exhibition tells the great joy but also the difficulties and dangers of pregnancy and childbirth in some areas of Sub-Saharan Africa. The shots making up Being a Mother in Ethiopia are by Bieke Depoorter, Magnum photographer, who travelled to see the CCM projects in the Somali Region and in Bale in February 2013. The opening night was a great party. The showman Captain Freedom led the event and introduced CCM President Marilena Bertini who underscored the importance for CCM to be present in a square again, **to meet people, inform them and in-**

**volve them.** The Turin Council member for culture Maurizio Bracchialarghe expressed appreciation and support and thanked CCM and Magnum Photos, especially its Director Lorenza Bravetta. The audience could admire the artist Francesco Sgrò of the Circus School of Turin Flic who performed a show on a Cyr wheel and the dancing school Yele Nba that narrated pregnancy through an Eastern African dance entitled Combien des petits? Beaucoup beaucoup beaucoup. The music of percussionists accompanied the evening till the opening of the exhibition by Chiara Borgogno, captain of the women volleyball team Torino Volley, sympathizer with the Campaign Smiles of African Mothers. In conclusion the proposal of the photographic competition "Mothers' Smiles Meet", with the presence of Fabio Buc-

ciarelli, prize-awarded photographer and member of the jury who will choose the shots which will be part of Smiles of African Mothers 2014.

The evening was made even more special by the participation of Pepino ice-creams that decided to take part into CCM campaign with the friendly Pinguino; part of the earnings come from selling the historical stick will support the projects for mothers and children health. ## The right to health

# Women and children in Ethiopia and CCM commitment

In Ethiopia mothers and children mortality rates are still among the highest in the world. The total population is 85 million; in 2011 there were 676 women dead every 100.000 childbirths and 37 children deceased out of 1000 births.

Women have a very high mortality risk during pregnancy and delivery, especially if belonging to poor and uneducated families. In a country where 83% people live in rural areas, reinforcement of primary health care, that is peripheral health structures located in remote areas, is critical to face the major problems; in fact it is considered as the main priority in the development programme of Ethiopian health system. Obstetric nurses of primary health structures often have no basic knowledge sufficient to recognize

and treat the causes of maternal and infant death (hemorrhage, infection, eclampsia etc) and they need technical assistance, formal and practical training.

Mothers and children health is not only affected by the lack of qualified professionals but also by the system inefficiency, by the scarcity of structures adequately equipped to face emergencies and by the limited access to care due to distances and insufficient transportation. Only one woman out of 5 undergoes 4 prenatal visits and only in 34% cases these are performed by qualified staff; only 48% receives tetanus vaccination before delivery, 10% is assisted by qualified professional during childbirth and over 60% does not consider necessary to go to the hospital for delivery.

CCM has been working in Ethiopia for 15 years to promote the right to health with particular consideration to the health of mothers and children. At present, our sites of intervention are: Bale area in the Oromia region where we are underpinning the health structures by training the staff and buying indispensable instruments to guarantee mothers and children health; the Somali Region where we try to improve health services and the referring system for local communities and refugees, very abundant in the area bordering Somalia; the Tigray Region where we are building a Centre for Teaching, Research and Care where both new and already working health professionals can be trained and become more qualified.

# Being a Mother in Ethiopia

In February 2013 the young Magnum photographer Bieke Depoorter travelled through the dusty roads of Southern Ethiopia, from Addis Ababa to Filtu and across the green landscapes of Bale to discover the life of women and children and to see what CCM has been doing for many years.

From this 10-days' travel comes the new section of the exhibition Smiles of African Mothers

dedicated to motherhood. The pictures the photographer gave CCM are the 20 she considered most representatives of what she saw. CCM chose 8 of them; they are a proposal for discovery and for a journey through traditions, situations and smiles of Sub-Saharan Africa and they represent the novelty for 2013.

This section about motherhood in Ethiopia begins a path across the different countries en-

compassing motherhood and childhood; a path lasting until 2015 when the campaign Smiles of African Mother will finish. By enlarging the exhibition every year with images of motherhood, childbirth, infancy and childhood in Ethiopia, Burundi and South Sudan, CCM wants to offer the possibility to know the realities where it works and the way how it supports local communities.

*Family and community attitudes may affect women's decisions and lead to delayed treatment or to the choice not to go to the hospital to give birth.*

*Gender discrimination is a relevant issue in the choice of human resources in Ethiopia: only 13% doctors, 11% medical staff and 39% nurses are women. Women are often uneasy in the presence of male medical staff.*

*The distance from health centres and hospitals is one of the causes of unassisted childbirth in Ethiopia. In the Somali Region in Ethiopia 9 out of 10 women deliver their babies at home.*

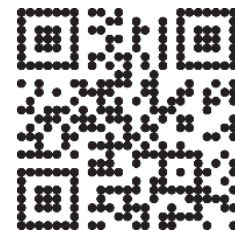
*Placenta has a high symbolic value and is treated like a human being. It is washed and buried at home or in the courtyard.*

# 1000 faces of the right to health A website to think and discuss together

At the beginning of June 2012 CCM together with Flylab started the project "1000 faces of the right to health". The project is promoted by the agency Piemonte Lavoro through the European Social Fund in the field "Actions to promote equality culture" and it plans to create an innovative instrument – a **multimedia website** – collecting video interviews and evidences from primary and secondary school students and from Piedmontese health professionals about the themes of discrimination and health. The project has two phases. **In the first part featuring the creation of the website** the focus will be

on the areas of discrimination, in particular health, and on the elaboration of the material needed to activate the website. The participation of students and health professionals will allow to have an archive of interviews where different generations, viewpoints and competences meet and interact. The video archive will be continually enhanced through new witnesses, coming from training courses and experiences both in Italy and abroad.

**In the second part the target is to promote the use of the website and its contents in schools**, gathering centres (like Casa del Quartiere at San

Salvario) and Piedmontese NGOs **in order to stimulate discussion and reflection about discrimination**. In schools, teaching courses will be organized to involve students within different laboratories. That will lead to discussion on health and discrimination and will produce new material to grant constant updating of the website.

The website will finally become part of the COP (Consorzio ONG Piemontesi) website and it will be available to all the NGOs of Consorzio, that will be able to use the videos for their teaching classes and for their archives.

## Diatech Labline: a firm beside Smiles of African Mother since last year

It’s been one year since when Diatech Lab Line, young firm from Jesi, Ancona, leader in the distribution of laboratory products and reagents for cellular and molecular biology, decided to support the Campaign Smiles of African Mothers. We can even say the firm and the campaign are growing together.

“It was a friend who introduced me to CCM – says Fabio Biondi, President of Diatech Lab Line. She, Cristiana Lo Nigro, a biologist born in our town, has been volunteering for CCM for many years. Thanks to Cristiana I met the President and the Director of CCM who told me about the association and the Campaign Smiles of African Mothers. I was immediately impressed and as at that time a

new society of Diatech Pharmacogenetics, Lab Line, was being established I thought that we could immediately start a support to the campaign. Practically we associated Diatech Lab Line with the Campaign, allocating 1 euro per invoice and imagining that our contribution could increase with the sales volume”

Actually the data seem to confirm the hypothesis: at present, six months after the beginning of 2013, the donations of the firm are already at the amount reached in 2012.

“We also promoted the collaboration of others, continues Fabio Biondi – for instance by inviting our customers to choose us also because we support the health of African Mothers and children

or by sending communications through our mailing list. Unluckily congresses and conventions are not frequent in live science. If they were we would like to propose a partnership and make it known on those occasions. Among the causes of the increase of the firm activities are the expansion of the sale network to Lombardy and Lazio and the larger range of marketed products due to the agreement with a firm in Seattle that will allow us to sell the Nanostring technology in Italy”.

**“We hope this new opening will have positive effects also on our support to CCM, – concludes Biondi – because Diatech Lab Line believes in this allegiance and wants to pledge to it”.**
